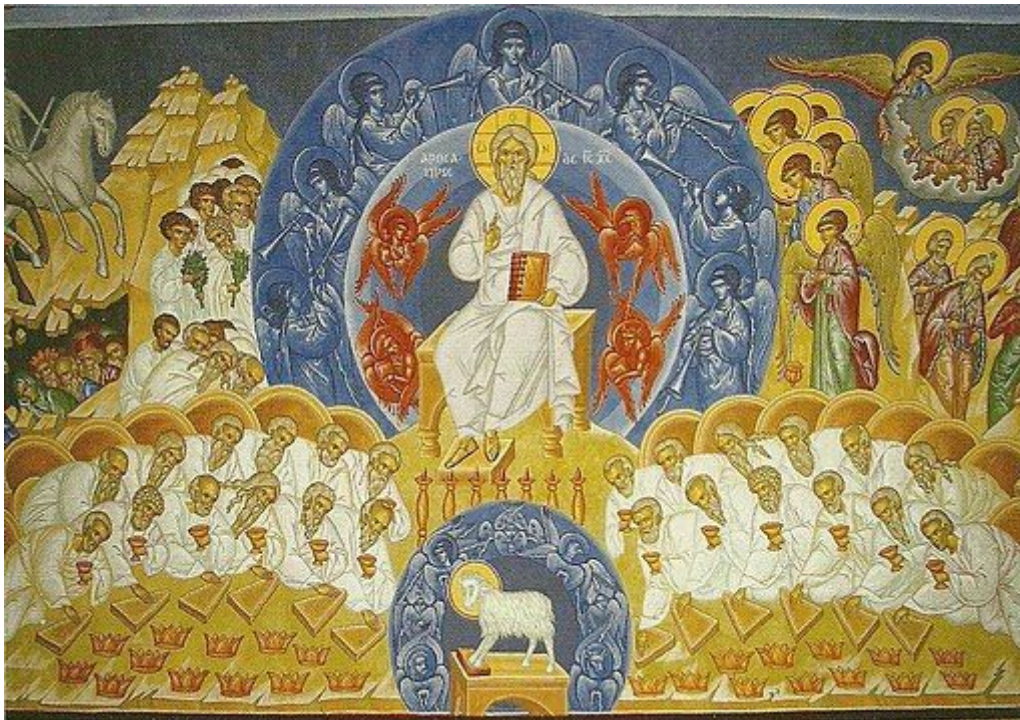

## Update from the Wesley Centre

2018 saw the Wesley staff working hard on promoting the Wesley Centre through a number of marketing avenues including a new version of our Fact Sheet and Brochure and were busy networking with other members of the community. After consulting with local GP's a decision was made to subsidise the gap fee for any client who has a Health Care Card and Mental Health Care Plan from the 1st June.

The Anger Management Program and our relationship with Corrections continued to grow and receive great feedback. 2019 sees the Wesley Centre branch out further into the Mental Health field with a view to offering Dual Diagnosis Counselling. This will complement other areas already included such as: Relationship and Family issues; Grief, loss and bereavement; Depression; Anxiety; Trauma; Anger Management and Stress Management.

Our counsellors are highly experienced and our fees are based on a sliding scale. We can be contacted directly or receive referrals from other agencies. You will be supported to cope, grow and heal in an environment that nurtures you and protects your privacy and dignity.

## OUR VISION FOR A JUST AUSTRALIA

#AUSVOTES2019

As pre-polling opens for the 2019 Australian election and the leaders face off in their first debate, we encourage Uniting Church members to think deeply about their vote.

Our pre-election vision statement Our Vision for a Just Australia invites us to think beyond ourselves to the big concerns for our country today.

Prepared by those working for justice in our Church, the statement expresses our hope for an Inclusive and Equal Society where all are equal and free to exercise our rights equally. In particular, we seek to create a society where women and children are safe in their own homes and communities.

There continues to be high rates of Domestic and family violence (DFV) in Australia, with around 1 in 4 women having experienced violence by an intimate partner since the age of 15. DFV is the leading cause of illness, disability and premature death among women aged 25 to 44.

Our UCA vision statement calls for a comprehensive approach to preventing gender-based violence. This includes challenging the social norms and practices that underpin it.

QUESTIONS for your candidates or for small groups:

What is your commitment to the equality of women across our community and what actions will you take to promote this?

How will you tackle the high rates of domestic and family violence, both in terms of prevention and supporting people who are affected?

What initiatives are already happening or could happen in your local community that could promote awareness of domestic and family violence and offer support for people impacted by this violence?

Consider having a Break the Silence Sunday in your congregation. A resource guide has been created with prayers, liturgies, sermon starters, music suggestions and more.
