
> The Holy Spirit told Philip, 'Go to that chariot and stay near it.'




2 Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading aloud the words of the prophet Isaiah. (Isaiah 53:7-8).

4 He invited Philip to sit in the chariot with him.





6 'In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth.'




7 'Please tell me who the prophet is talking about,' the Ethiopian said, 'himself or someone else?'
